WHITES BY THE BOTTLE

Chardonnay

2009 Ghost Pines, North Coast (CA)	\$41
Shows some creamy, oaky notes and good varietal flavors of pineapple, apple and pear.	

2008 Morgan Highland, Santa Lucia Highlands	\$54
W.E. 91 pts. Bone dry, high in acidity, and compellingly complex. The dryness makes the lime zest and kiwi flavors star on their own, while new French oak adds a gorgeous layer of toasty cream.	

Pinot Grigio

2009 Cantina Terlano, Italy	\$42
Textbook Pinot Grigio that is fruity, fragrant and creamy smooth in the mouth without ever appearing heavy or flat. You'll get aromas of yellow fruit with sweet peach flavors in the mouth.	

Sauvignon Blanc

2009 Honig, Napa Valley	\$32
Perfectly balanced grapefruit and melon aromas with flavors accented by lime and mango. A round mid-palate is followed by a vibrant, crisp, lingering finish.

REDS BY THE BOTTLE

Cabernet

2006 William Hill, Napa Valley \$45

A medium-bodied, silky-textured Cab with standard cassis fruit flavors and a touch of warmth on the finish.

2007 Chateau Ste. Michelle Cold Creek Vineyard, Washington \$50

Firm and juicy, this old vine Cabernet is loaded with black fruit. It's a generous mouthfeel of almost pure Cab (1% Merlot is added) layered with intense flavors of currant and cherry.

Malbec

2007 Alamos Seleccion, Argentina \$41

The nose is full of ripe blueberry fruits with notes of sweet spice. The mouthfeel is full and rich with ripe black cherry and cassis fruit layered with spicy black pepper. The finish shows a supple, silky texture with a bright acidity and a stony minerality.

Merlot

2007 William Hill, Napa Valley \$45

Aromas of ripe black cherry, red berries and licorice are accented by smoky, spicy oak. The flavors are open, bright red fruit in the mouth, with soft tannins and a long, supple finish.

Merlot/Cabernet/Syrah Blend

2008 Hedges Red Mountain, Washington \$52

W.E. 90 pts. 56% Merlot, 30% Cabernet, 8% Syrah and 6% Cabernet Franc. Smooth and silky in the mouth, it mixes red and blue fruits with a ripe, round mid-palate and light chocolate and toasted nuts to finish.

Pinot Noir

2007 Steele, Santa Barbara \$45

Here's a supple, delicious Pinot Noir. The wine is elegantly silky, with satisfying flavors of cherries, currants, smoky vanilla and fresh herbs.

2008 Morgan Twelve Clones, Santa Lucia Highlands \$64

A big, voluptuous wine with highly extracted, jammy cherry, currant and cola flavors, it's a palate flatterer.

Zinfandel

2008 Rancho Zabaco, Dry Creek Valley \$38

Ripe and spicy, this Zin brims with blackberries, plums and tobacco. It's a dry, full-bodied wine with rich, firm tannins.
